After spending some time at the Center, we visited the homes of the newly arrived children to better understand their living conditions and identify how we might be able to support them further.

We were warmly welcomed by the families, who kindly showed us around their homes. Seeing where the children come from added a new layer of understanding —it was heartbreakingly to witness their difficult circumstances, especially knowing these children personally. Despite everything, they continue to greet us with smiles, gratitude, and a remarkable sense of joy, which left us deeply moved.

Many of the children live in extremely small shacks, offering little protection from the elements or insects. These cramped spaces are often shared with large families, and many lack basic necessities like mattresses, blankets, food, electricity, and running water.

These visits were not only emotional but also incredibly eye-opening. They allowed us to see the children from a new perspective and admire their resilience even more. Their positivity in the face of such hardship inspires us to continue our work with greater dedication and to extend our support beyond the Center, reaching their families as well.

This semester, we were once again reminded of the incredible kindness that exists in this world—thanks to all the generous donations that brought comfort, warmth, and joy to the children at our Center. Because of your support, the kids were able to face the cold Namibian winter wrapped in warm blankets and cozy hats. Even more special: they received custom-made tracksuits designed to match their school uniforms—allowing them to stay warm while proudly wearing clothing that reflects their school identity. For many, it was the first time they had something new, made just for them.

Towards the end of the school year, we volunteers also launched a fundraising project within our own circles of friends and acquaintances. The response was overwhelming, allowing us to begin a house construction project for a family whose children are also part of the Center.

It touched us deeply to see how many people were ready to give—whether through time, money, or simply showing they care. In a world that so often feels heavy with crisis and uncertainty, moments like these remind us that hope is not lost.

What stays with us is the feeling of connection. Of hope. Of the quiet but powerful belief that goodness will always find a way—and that when people come together with compassion and purpose, truly anything is possible.
